Calvin Wells, Esq.

Dear Sir. I inclose the answer to my dispatch which I received this morning. In consequence of the lightening no answer could be got through until this morning.

So much delay has occurred in its transmission that I have not thought it best to wait until I could hear from you but have telegraphed to have the body of your son sent by Express to Bangor. I sympathize most deeply with you in your affliction.
